Insp. WILLIAMS and S/Sgt. SIMMILL spoke briefly with a Cst. John CATER. Cst. CATER is presently a member of the Project EVENHANDED team and was previously stationed at Coquitlam Det. on the Serious Crime Unit. He advised that he was present during an interview with Willie PICKTON at Coquitlam which was done on January 19th, 2000. Cst. CATER was new to the section and indicated that a Cst. Ruth YURKIW was the lead interviewer with respect to Willie PICKTON on the ELLINGSEN matter. Cst. YURKIW was to mentor Cst. CATER at Coquitlam Det. after just arriving on the unit. Cst. CATER went into the interview cold and had just been as indicated transferred to the Serious Crime Unit.

During this particular interview, it is noted that PICKTON was in the company of one Gina HOUSTON who was present during this interview. Steps were taken in an attempt to interview PICKTON alone, however, he would not allow members to interview him without HOUSTON being present.

It is noted that Cst. CATER was very specific indicating after having come to the Project EVENHANDED team that PICKTON was one of hundreds of suspects or persons of interest in regards to the missing persons. It is further noted that in February 2002 Cst. CATER was one of the two members from the EVENHANDED team that was called upon to assist the Coquitlam Det. members who were executing a search warrant at the PICKTON farm in relation to information they had received on restricted weapons offences. It was at this time that when they executed the search warrant for these firearms that personal belongings of some of the missing women was discovered in the PICKTON trailer.

Cst. CATER is presently the affiant writer on Project EVENHANDED and was able to provide us a certified copy of Sgt. CONNOR's (then Cpl.)

Please accept this as our formal request for assistance in the noted matter. We need the aid of an external review team of 2 members to conduct a review of the conduct of "E" Division members and detachments in relation to the missing women and suspect PICTON, prior to the establishment and full operation of the Missing Women Task Force.

The purpose of the review is to allow us to prepare for current and further civil litigation in this matter.

All costs related to this review will be borne by *E* Division.

Preliminary inquiries have been conducted Informally with Insp. Bob Williams who advises he can take this on and will be assisted by S/Sgt. Kevin Simmill, both of "K" Serious Crimes - North. We understand that they would be able to commence this undertaking on or about the 15th of September which works well for us.

The mandate for the review team will be:

To to assist Department of Justice counsel in defending the civil action brought by Karin Joesbury in relation to the death of her daughter Andrea (aka Angela), and further civil actions that are anticipated by family members of other missing women, in providing a response to the following allegations set out in the Statement of Claim filed in the Joesbury action:

- 1. that the RCMP failed to properly investigate information from various sources received between 1983 and 2002, which information indicated that the lands located at 953 Dominion Avenue in Port Coquitiam, and that Robert William Pickton were involved in the disappearances;
- 2. that the RCMP, having identified the existence of a possible serial killer, failed to put in place proper or adequate investigative resources in order to enable a meaningful and effective investigation; and
- 3. that the RCMP failed to share information with, and communicate with, other police forces and officers, that would have assisted in detecting Robert Pickton's activities.

I've used the words of Ms. Joesbury's counsel. Essentially, the allegations are that the RCMP failed to properly investigate tips about Pickton and his property, that the RCMP failed to devote adequate resources to the investigation, and that the RCMP failed to work together with other police forces.

In order to defend the civil claim(s), counsel will need to know:

- a) what information the RCMP had, and when;
- b) what the RCMP did to follow up on the information;
- c) If the RCMP did not follow up on the information, why not;
- d) what contact the RCMP had with other police forces;
- e) what information was shared among police forces;
- f) If information was not shared, why it was not shared;
- g) what resources were allocated to the missing women investigation;
- h) If inadequate resources were allocated, why;
- i) more specifically, what information the RCMP had with respect to Pickton and his property.

Counsel will also need in due course to obtain copies of all files, notes, videotapes, audiotapes, plans, photographs, etc. relating to these questions (I would ask that the review team assemble these materials).

As the Joesbury claim proceeds, or when other civil actions are commenced, further allegations may be advanced against the RCMP. Many of those raised by Ms. Joesbury's counsel were first raised in the media. Therefore, if the review team notes any new criticisms of RCMP conduct, the review team is to investigate and that their report assists counsel with a response to the new criticisms.

Finally, on completion of their work, a report is to prepared outlining the review team's findings with both the report and any documents discussing the review, marked with the heading "PREPARED FOR THE PURPOSE OF CURRENT AND ANTICIPATED CIVIL LITIGATION".

While in Vancouver, the contact for the review team will be C/Supt. Al Macintyre, Operations Officer, LMD District and he can be contacted at (604) 502-6915 or on cell (604) 317-9057. We would suggest that flight arrangements can best be facilitated using Abbotsford Airport and we will provide a police vehicle for their use. In addition, we have identified two Senior NCOs who will be able to assist Insp. Williams.

Given that we now have time constraints, a diary date of October 15 for the preliminary report has been set.

- 2. That the RCMP, having identified the existence of a possible serial killer, failed to put in place proper or adequate investigative resources in order to enable a meaningful and effective investigation; and,
- 3. That the RCMP failed to share information with, and communicate with, other Police forces and Officers that would have assisted in detecting Robert Pickton's activities.

In this correspondence, I have used the words of Ms. Joesbury's Counsel. Essentially, the allegations are that the RCMP failed to properly investigate tips about Pickton and his property; that the RCMP failed to devote adequate resources to the investigation and, that the RCMP failed to work together with other police forces.

In order to defend the civil claim(s), Counsel will require the following facts:

- a) what information the RCMP had, and when;
- b) what the RCMP did to follow up on the information;
- c) if the RCMP did not follow up on the information, why not;
- d) what contact the RCMP had with other Police forces;
- e) what information was shared among Police forces;
- f) if information was not shared, why it was not shared;
- g) what resources were allocated to the missing women investigation;
- h) if inadequate resources were allocated, why;
- i) more specifically, what information the RCMP had with respect to Pickton and his property.

In due course, Counsel will also require copies of all files, notes, videotapes, audiotapes, plans, photographs, etc. relating to these questions (I would ask that the review team assemble these materials).

As the Joesbury claim proceeds, or when other civil action(s) are commenced, further allegations may be advanced against the RCMP. Many of those raised by Ms. Joesbury's Counsel were first raised in the media. Therefore, if the review team notes any new criticisms of RCMP conduct, the review team is asked to investigate and that their report assists Counsel with a response to the new criticisms.

Finally, on completion of their work, I would request that a report be prepared outlining the review team's findings, with both the report and any documents discussing the review, marked with the heading "PREPARED FOR THE PURPOSE OF CURRENT AND ANTICIPATED CIVIL LITIGATION".

While in Vancouver, the contact for the review team will be C/Supt. Al Macintyre, Operations Officer, LMD District. He may be contacted at (604) 502-6915 or on cellular (604) 317-9057. In addition, we have identified two Senior NCOs who will be able to assist Insp. Williams. We would suggest that flight arrangements can best be facilitated using Abbotsford Airport. Police transport will be provided for the use of the external review team when in British Columbia.

Given the time constraints we face, it is requested that the external review team provide me with a preliminary report by October 15th, 2002.
