



"I told him, 'Don't worry. I'm not going to say anything. I just want my dope and my booze.'

"So he said, 'I'll take ya.' He walked me out of the barn back to the trailer. "I went to grab a bag, just put some clothes in it, or whatever, and I said I'd be back. He said, 'No, no, no,' you know. He gave me a hundred dollars and said, like, 'You can go and buy booze or drugs, whatever you want. I'll pay for a cab, I'll call you a cab, and you can phone me tomorrow and I'll pick you up tomorrow.'

"So he called me a cab. And I must have walked—like, he walked with me right up, like, till I got into the cab to make sure I was in the cab.*

"When I got in the cab, my feet were all mud, the driveway was just muddy. So I got into the cab and I went to go buy more drugs. I ended up back in Surrey. I drank, I got high for a few days.

"I did go back. When I went back, like I called him first and told him that I was getting back together with Ron Menard."

It was a lie, said Lynn, but she told Willie that because she was afraid for her life. Although Lynn told people that she had moved away from the Pickton farm for good, that wasn't true either. Whether she was living there again full-time is not certain, but on March 29 and May 30, 1999, there are records of ambulance calls to 963 Dominion to attend to Lynn Ellingsen, who had overdosed on drugs. Willie was the one who called the ambulance.

The day after Constable Jennifer Hyland stopped Willie Pickton on the Twelfth Street stroll in New Westminster was about the same time Georgina Papin vanished. At thirty-five Georgina was the mother of seven children, the last two being twins born just a few months earlier. At first no one in the Downtown Eastside could

believe she had joined the legions of the community's disappeared. Not Georgina—she was too street-smart, too tough, too well connected. The Papins were a legendary Native family from a wealthy four-band reserve, Alberta's Hobbema Cree First Nation, southwest of Edmonton, and her younger brother Rick was a much-feared criminal, respected and obeyed even when he was doing time in prison. No one dared cross him.

Georgina, who was born in March 1964, was one of nine children; they will admit, with gales of laughter, that almost no one can figure out the family tree. It takes a diagram to remember it all. The easiest way to explain it, they say, is that they all had the same mother but different fathers. That's not entirely true, but it's close.

Their mother, Maggie Rattlesnake, was born in 1942 and had her first baby at seventeen, with a man named Reno Parsons, "a German guy from Squamish," explains Cynthia Cardinal—usually called Cindi—Georgina's sister. That baby, a girl named Debbie, died, but Maggie then met a man named John Ermineskin, of the Hobbema Cree. Cynthia was the child they had together, so she is the oldest. Maggie's next partner was George Papin, and this time she married him; their first baby together was Georgina. Next came the first baby boy, Rick, followed by Tammy.

Not happy with George Papin, Maggie found another partner, a man named Larry; they had a boy they named George Junior. Maggie finally concluded that George Papin was the best of the bunch, so she returned to him and they had three more children, Randy, Elana and Bonnie. Maggie died at thirty-seven, and at that point the children basically had only each other. Although they grew up in foster homes or with relatives, they always made efforts to stay in touch.

Tammy, the fifth in line, did a lot of research to find her brothers and sisters and keep track of them. Rick became the most notorious, but he wasn't the only one who had done time in prison; so had Georgina and Tammy. By 1985 the siblings had connected and arranged a Christmas reunion in a bar in Edmonton. The first thing they did was compare how many children each had; Rick led the way

Missing - Foul Play Suspected

On 97-04-30, CI-PERS reported that her tenant, Richard LITTLE, was missing. CI-PERS advised that LITTLE was last seen on 97-04-23. According to CI-PERS it was unusual for LITTLE to stay away for so long and to neglect his pet cat.

Police learned that LITTLE had gone to see Gina HOUSTON at her residence in Port Coquitlam, B.C., on 97-04-23.

HOUSTON confirmed that LITTLE had visited her on 97-04-23 and had stayed overnight. LITTLE left on 97-04-24 at approximately 1900 hours and stated he was going to work in Vancouver.

LITTLE is a trans-sexual with a female upper body and male genitalia. He dresses as a female and works as a prostitute along the skids of east Hastings Street in Vancouver. LITTLE often spent the night at HOUSTON's residence, before returning to Vancouver.

LITTLE would phone HOUSTON every hour when working to let her know that everything was okay. However, that night, LITTLE never phoned. HOUSTON waited all night and all the next day for a call.

LITTLE's family, friends, and known associates have been contacted, with negative results.

LITTLE's bank records were examined and showed that his last transactions were on 97-04-23. His mail was examined at the post office, and it was determined that he last picked up his mail on 97-04-22.

LITTLE was receiving social assistance, but has not cashed any cheques since April, 1997. Also, Social Services records show that LITTLE was scheduled to attend a "Starting Point" seminar on 97-04-29. These seminars are directed at helping welfare recipients find work. LITTLE did not attend, which is unusual, as failure to attend can result in a suspension of benefits.

LITTLE has been in and out of institutions for years. In 1996, he was released from Kent Institution, a federal prison in Agassiz. It appears he has had several "romantic" liaisons with fellow inmates, who were also checked, with negative results.

As per our conversation on 98-10-14, please find attached most of the file with regards to Taressa Ann WILLIAMS.

In a nutshell, WILLIAMS was first reported missing to this detachment 89-01-17. She had been placed on CPIC at this time along with her dental records. Sometime over the following couple of years, she was removed from CPIC and the file was concluded. We have been in touch with the investigating officer at the time and he has no recollection of the file. The only indication I could find at all that WILLIAMS had been reported missing was a hit on PIRS which listed WILLIAMS as Tip 60 in an older Kamloops file. Investigation into this revealed that Kamloops had had an unidentified human remains file in which a copy of the CPIC printout listing WILLIAMS as missing was attached.

WILLIAMS was apparently involved in prostitution and drugs at the time of her disappearance.

On 98-03-13, the South Surrey office of the RCMP was approached by Semiahmoo band counsellor. He had been made aware of human remains found in Stanley Park through a newspaper article run 98-03-05. Worried that the remains may have been WILLIAMS, the family requested that the file be re-opened. As the file seemed to have originally been from White Rock, it was brought to us again.

Writer has yet to ascertain why the file was ever concluded. The circumstances surrounding WILLIAMS' disappearance are indeed suspicious.

Writer has conducted numerous checks with various Social Services, Indian Affairs, Medical, etc. It would seem that WILLIAMS, if alive, is not receiving any sort of government subsidies. She has never reapplied for a birth certificate and has never applied for a Native Status Card. These checks were also completed for the state of Washington.

WILLIAMS' mother, CI-PERS has proven to be difficult to arrange meetings with. I was finally able to meet with her on 98-09-26. She recalled being telephoned by WILLIAMS sometime in late November or early December of 1988. WILLIAMS had called to state that she was on her way to the GI-PERS from Vancouver. She had given birth to twins

88-04-30 and the trip to the reserve was intended as a visit with her children who were living with their grandmother. She never arrived at the reserve and was not heard from again.

CI-PERS

recalls that WILLIAMS had been living at the SUNRISE HOTEL in downtown Vancouver. CI-PERS

had been there on occasion to visit WILLIAMS. She lived there with her pimp/boyfriend one CI-PERS

also related that WILLIAMS had a close friend at the time of her disappearance.

This girl's name is CI-PERS

apparently now lives in Surrey and is said to be actively looking for WILLIAMS herself. I have yet to contact CI-PERS but hope to soon.

I hope this helps you to understand the file. The details of the investigation are included. Should you have any questions or require any further info such as the off-line CPIC searches, please do not hesitate to call. Once again my number here is 531-5527.
