Fred,

Further to our discussion today, the following information would allow me to make a reasonable statistical assessment of the missing persons/homicide trend in the Downtown Eastside:

Annual totals, from 1980 to present (the further back the better; Lori was going to look at data from 1970, so if she does then I will use all the information), for:

- (1) number of missing persons reported;
- (2) number of missing persons located;
- (3) approximate average time length between the report of a missing person and his or her location (a rough estimate is good enough);
- (4) number of solved murders and attempt murders; and
- (5) number of unsolved murders and attempt murders;

for Downtown Eastside street people.

I will attempt to locate the additional necessary information from SOS (serious sexual assaults that could have been murders), the RCMP (murder cases where the victim originated within the Downtown Eastside), and the Provincial Prostitution Unit (prostitute population counts).

If there are any questions about the type of data that I am looking for, please let me know.
