MISSING WOMEN COMMISSION OF INQUIRY

AFFIDAVIT

I, Dwight Dammann, retired peace officer, of the city of Campbell River, in the province of British Columbia, MAKE OATH AND SAY THAT:

1. I am a retired Staff Sergeant of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police ("RCMP"), and was a member of the RCMP from 1970 until my retirement in June 2008. From April 1990 until June 2008, I served at the RCMP detachment in Campbell River, B.C. (the "Detachment"). Attached as **Exhibit "A"** to this Affidavit is a copy of my curriculum vitae.
 2. I have personal knowledge of the matters and facts set out in this Affidavit, except where stated to be based on information and belief and where so stated I believe them to be true.
- A. The Campbell River RCMP Detachment**
3. During the 1997 to 1998 period, the Detachment employed approximately 50 members and was divided into two sections:
 - a. General Duty Section ("GDS"): consisting of uniformed officers divided into four watches. GDS also had a two-member uniformed Traffic Section, a three-member uniformed Forensics Identification Section and a uniformed member in charge of the Community Policing/Victim Services Unit.

b. General Investigative Section ("GIS"): consisting of seven plainclothes officers.

4. I was the officer in charge of GIS from August 1997 to August 1998. As commander of GIS, I supervised investigations of all major incidents within the Campbell River community and surrounding area, as well as several undercover operations centred on drug abuse, homicides, prostitution and property crime.

i. Calls to the Detachment

5. During regular office hours, the general procedure at the Detachment was for incoming telephone calls to the Detachment to be directed to a municipal employee at the Detachment's front counter and the call would then be transferred to one of four dispatchers. The dispatcher on duty would dispatch the call to a uniformed officer or to the specific officer the caller had requested to speak with, provided that officer was on duty. After midnight, incoming calls would be directed to the communications centre in Courtenay, B.C. The Courtenay dispatcher would direct the call, via mobile radio, to a uniformed officer.
6. Incoming telephone calls to the Detachment that involved making a report of a missing person would be directed to a uniformed officer.
7. It was not general practice for the switchboard operators at the Detachment to give callers advice when they called the Detachment, although it may have occurred from time to time in minor situations.
8. Any notes from telephone conversations, if kept, and if the caller spoke to an officer, would be recorded by the officer in his or her notebooks. A passing telephone conversation might not have been recorded. Following the RCMP's file retention procedure, any records of phone calls to the Detachment from the 1997 to 1998 period would have been purged.

B. The Marnie Frey Missing Person Investigation

9. I know **CI-PERS** and **CI-PERS** and knew them for a number of years prior to 1997. **CI-PERS** and **CI-PERS** are Marnie Frey's ("Marnie") step-parents. I met Marnie on a few occasions when she was approximately 17 or 18 years old and living in Campbell River.
10. My first recollection of speaking with **CI-PERS** about her concerns regarding Marnie's whereabouts was shortly before Christmas in 1997. **CI-PERS** contacted me and told me that Marnie always called on **CI-PERS** birthday, November 5, but that she had failed to do so that year. **CI-PERS** told me that she and **CI-PERS** had not heard from Marnie since August 1997. I asked **CI-PERS** if she thought Marnie would call at Christmas and **CI-PERS** answered affirmatively. I told **CI-PERS** to contact me if Marnie did not call her over Christmas and I would then open a missing person file.
11. On December 29, 1997, I received a phone call from **CI-PERS** to report that Marnie had not called home for Christmas. I opened a file 97-15406 for Marnie's missing person investigation (the "Frey File"). Attached as **Exhibit "B"** to this Affidavit is a copy of the Frey File.
12. **CI-PERS** informed me that when she spoke with Marnie in August 1997, Marnie was living in the East Hastings area of Vancouver. **CI-PERS** further informed me that both she and **CI-PERS** believed that, because of Marnie's history of acute heroin and cocaine abuse and her association with criminal activity, she had likely met with foul play or overdosed. **CI-PERS** advised me that Marnie was working as a sex trade worker, but was not working with a pimp and was receiving financial assistance from the B.C. Ministry of Human Resources ("MHR"). **CI-PERS** informed me that although Marnie was a street person, she would always contact her step-parents in Campbell River for money. **CI-PERS** also confirmed Marnie's description and provided me with descriptions of Marnie's tattoos.
13. I told **CI-PERS** that I would forward a copy of our file to the Vancouver Police Department ("VPD") since Marnie was believed to be living in Vancouver and they might have had

recent contact with Marnie or have information about any unidentified female bodies. I told **CI-PERS** that I would do as much as I could from Campbell River.

i. Investigative Steps Taken

14. During the December 29, 1997, conversation with **CI-PERS** I asked her to locate any dental records for Marnie so that they could be kept on file and entered into the Canadian Police Information Centre ("CPIC") database entry for Marnie as a missing person.
15. On December 29, 1997, I forwarded a copy of the Frey File to the VPD, attention Missing Persons, and to the RCMP "E" Division Drug Section Unit 1 (Street Crew).
16. Also on December 29, 1997, I conducted searches of the CPIC and Personal Information Retrieval System ("PIRS") databases for Marnie. The CPIC search yielded no information about Marnie and PIRS revealed an entry from Langley, B.C., from June 1997, and, at that time, the address Marnie provided was the **CI-PERS** address in Campbell River. PIRS also contained an entry for Marnie as a suspect in a Burnaby RCMP file from August 1997.
17. I also made inquiries with MHR and other agencies and was able to determine that Marnie last received financial assistance from MHR at the end of September 1997, and, at that time, she had no fixed address. Marnie had no further contact with MHR after September 1997.
18. I am informed by Corporal Shane Parsons of the RCMP, "E" Division, Missing Women Commission Liaison Team, and believe that during the course of Project Evenhanded's investigation of Marnie, Project Evenhanded investigators obtained welfare cheque #0253317 issued to Marnie on September 24, 1997. The cheque had been endorsed "Marnie Lee FREY" and had other markings on the back, including a thumb print, indicating that the cheque was cashed or deposited by Marnie at a Canadian Cheque Company outlet on the same date as it was issued, September 24, 1997. Attached as **Exhibit "C"** to this Affidavit is a copy of Marnie's September 24, 1997, endorsed cheque.

19. On December 30, 1997, I spoke with M. Donovan, an investigator with MHR and requested that he conduct a Canada-wide search of all MHR agencies to determine if Marnie had been receiving financial assistance in any other province. Mr. Donovan stated that he would attempt to search all provinces to determine if Marnie was receiving assistance elsewhere.
20. Also on December 30, 1997, I drafted a letter to Marnie's orthodontist, Dr. Mark Lawrence, requesting that he chart Marnie's dental data so that the records could be entered into CPIC. CI-PERS attended the Detachment and provided me with Marnie's dental x-rays from Dr. Lawrence. CI-PERS also signed a medical release form for the release of Marnie's medical records from the Quinsam Clinic. I asked CI-PERS to obtain the records from the Quinsam Clinic as well as obtain Marnie's blood type for entry into her missing person report.
21. At this time, CI-PERS also informed me that two weeks earlier, she had received a phone call from Marnie's natural mother, CI-PERS, who was residing in Fort Nelson, B.C. CI-PERS stated that CI-PERS had told her that Marnie had called recently asking for money but that CI-PERS had refused her request. CI-PERS also stated that she did not believe CI-PERS to be very credible. I contacted the Fort Nelson RCMP detachment by fax and requested that they contact CI-PERS to determine if she had been in contact with Marnie and if she had any contact information for her.
22. On December 31, 1997, I added Marnie to CPIC as a missing person.
23. Also on December 31, 1997, I received a fax from Constable Kozlowski of the Fort Nelson RCMP, informing me that he interviewed CI-PERS and she advised that she had not heard from Marnie for several months, but provided the name of two people who might have been contacted by Marnie: CI-PERS and CI-PERS. CI-PERS is Marnie's natural father who was residing in Mission, B.C. I contacted the Mission RCMP detachment and requested that an investigator contact CI-PERS and determine if he had had any contact with Marnie.

24. On the same date, I called Sylvia from ViCLAS and requested that the Found Human Remains Databank be searched for any unidentified bodies matching Marnie's description. Sylvia advised that the search of the Found Human Remains Databank was negative, and suggested that I contact the VPD Coroner's Liaison Unit. I subsequently contacted Ed Tempest of the VPD Coroner's Liaison Unit and was advised that there were no unidentified bodies matching Marnie's description.
25. Also on December 31, 1997, [CI-PERS] attended the Detachment and provided me with Marnie's blood type as well as a description of additional body scars to assist in identifying Marnie, which I added to Marnie's CPIC entry. I informed [CI-PERS] of the inquiries made with [CI-PERS] in Fort Nelson and that we were making inquiries with [CI-PERS] in Mission. I asked [CI-PERS] for a recent photograph of Marnie, but [CI-PERS] did not have a photograph as recent as the 1995 photograph in possession of the RCMP. [CI-PERS] indicated that the 1995 photograph was a good likeness of Marnie. [CI-PERS] also provided me with the name of a possible associate of Marnie who was residing in Vancouver.
26. On January 2, 1998 [CI-PERS] called and asked if we had heard anything as a result of our inquiries. I advised [CI-PERS] that we had yet to receive any further information and that I had contacted ViCLAS and the VPD Coroner's Liaison Unit and that those searches were negative. I advised [CI-PERS] that I did not expect to have any response to our inquiries for another week.
27. On January 5, 1998, I received a CPIC message from Constable Dyson of the Mission RCMP stating that he had interviewed [CI-PERS], who stated that he had not had any contact with Marnie for at least 12 months and that the only knowledge he had of Marnie was that she had been working as a sex trade worker in Burnaby.
28. Also on January 5, 1998, [CI-PERS] called and stated that she had not received any further information about Marnie over the weekend. I advised [CI-PERS] that the Mission RCMP had spoken with [CI-PERS] and that he had no information. [CI-PERS] asked what further action she should take and I suggested that we wait for the result of inquiries from the VPD on the street.

29. On January 6, 1998, CI-PERS called and stated that she received a phone call from a long distance number and that the caller asked to speak to Marnie. When CI-PERS told the caller that Marnie was not living there, the caller had told CI-PERS to tell Marnie that she was dead and then hung up. I contacted B.C. Tel Security to try and determine where the call had originated and had a trace placed on the call.
30. On January 8, 1998, CI-PERS called and stated that on January 7, 1998, she received phone calls from the Vancouver community agencies V.I.D.U.F. and D.E.Y.E.S. Both agencies were attempting to follow-up on Marnie as they had not heard from her in six months. I advised CI-PERS that I would call both agencies to determine if they knew or could disclose any more information about Marnie.
31. I called V.I.D.U.F. and spoke with CI-PERS who stated that if Marnie did contact her agency, she would encourage Marnie to contact her family. CI-PERS also informed me that she had advised D.E.Y.E.S. employees that Marnie had been reported missing.
32. On January 9, 1998, I received a voicemail message from CI-PERS of D.E.Y.E.S., requesting a recent photograph of Marnie.
33. On January 12, 1998, I spoke with CI-PERS and advised her that I had not received any feedback from the VPD or the RCMP "E" Division Drug Section Unit 1(Street Crew). I advised CI-PERS that, with her permission, I would send a copy of Marnie's photograph to D.E.Y.E.S. I also advised CI-PERS that I would send a copy of the Frey File to the Burnaby RCMP detachment as Marnie had frequented the Burnaby area in the past year.
34. On January 13, 1998, I contacted MHR investigator, CI-PERS to determine whether Marnie was receiving financial assistance in any other provinces. CI-PERS advised that his inquiries in the three Western provinces revealed that Marnie was not collecting any financial assistance from Social Services in those provinces and that he would make further inquiries in Eastern Canada.
35. Also on January 13, 1998, I received a CPIC message from Sandra Cameron of the VPD Missing Person Unit, advising that the VPD had not had contact with Marnie for some time and that the last time the VPD had contact with Marnie was early 1998. I called Ms.

Cameron to confirm that the VPD had not had contact with Marnie since early 1997, and not early 1998 as stated in her message.

36. Finally, on January 13, 1998, I forwarded a copy of Marnie's photograph to D.E.Y.E.S.
37. On January 14, 1998, I received voicemail messages from **CI-PERS** of MHR and Sandra Cameron of the VPD. **CI-PERS** advised that his inquiries in Ontario revealed that Marnie was not receiving financial assistance in that province. Ms. Cameron's message advised that the CPIC message was in fact incorrect and should have read early 1997.
38. On January 20, 1998, **CI-PERS** called and I advised her that the VPD had not had any contact with Marnie since early 1997. I further informed **CI-PERS** that I would be contacting the Burnaby RCMP detachment to request any information they might have concerning Marnie's whereabouts.
39. On January 21, 1998, I sent a request for information regarding Marnie to the Burnaby RCMP.
40. On February 5, 1998, I received a memorandum from Corporal MacDonald of the Burnaby RCMP Drug Section, stating that they had generated a file on Marnie and had passed on copies of Marnie's photograph to their briefing board. Corporal MacDonald further advised that they had notified their Neighbourhood Liaison Unit members, who worked in the area most frequented by sex trade workers, about Marnie's missing person report. Corporal MacDonald advised that they would continue to make inquiries to try to locate Marnie and would advise accordingly.
41. On February 5, 1998, I also called **CI-PERS** to advise her of the investigative steps taken to locate Marnie and that I would continue to keep her informed of the file status.
42. On February 17, 1998, **CI-PERS** called to inform me that her step-son, **CI-PERS**, suggested that Marnie was likely living in Edmonton and that she had gone there approximately one year earlier. **CI-PERS** indicated that Marnie had gone to Edmonton before and that, at that time, she had been receiving financial assistance from the MHR in

Alberta. I contacted MHR investigator, CI-PERS and requested that inquiries be made with MHR Alberta to determine if Marnie was receiving any financial assistance through that agency.

43. On February 20, 1998, MHR investigator, CI-PERS called to advise me that Marnie was not receiving any financial assistance from MHR in Alberta.
44. On March 3, 1998, I called CI-PERS to inform her that, to date, I had not been able to locate Marnie. I further advised CI-PERS that I would continue to contact her with any updates and I requested that she keep me informed of any information she might hear as to Marnie's whereabouts.
45. On March 5, 1998, CI-PERS called to advise me of a close associate of Marnie's, Mandy Blakemore. CI-PERS stated that she had contacted Ms. Blakemore's family and that they had not had any contact with Ms. Blakemore for several months and believed her to be incarcerated. CI-PERS suggested that Ms. Blakemore might be able to provide information about Marnie's whereabouts.
46. On March 6, 1998, I contacted the VPD Missing Person Unit by fax and requested that the VPD make inquiries with Mandy Blakemore regarding Marnie's whereabouts.
47. On March 23, 1998, I received a fax from Detective Al Howlett of the VPD Missing Person Unit, advising me that Mandy Blakemore had been located and interviewed. Detective Howlett advised that Ms. Blakemore stated that she saw Marnie about six months earlier but had no knowledge of her present whereabouts. Detective Howlett further advised that checks with social assistance and AIDS Vancouver proved negative, but that the VPD had contact with Marnie on August 14, 1997, and, at that time, Marnie provided an address in Campbell River.
48. I called CI-PERS on March 23, 1998, and advised her of the information from Detective Howlett.
49. On April 2, 1998, CI-PERS called and told me that she had heard on the news that there were unidentified bodies found in Seattle.

50. On April 8, 1998, I contacted Sandra Cameron of the VPD Missing Person Unit regarding the unidentified bodies in Seattle. Ms. Cameron advised me that she had not yet received word from Seattle regarding any unidentified bodies and that I should contact the Chief Medical Examiner's office in Washington State.
51. On April 14, 1998, [CI-PERS] called and told me that [CI-PERS] provided her with some information that he had received from his natural mother, [CI-PERS], about Marnie's whereabouts. [CI-PERS] told [CI-PERS] that Marnie was living in Edmonton and working as a sex trade worker with an older female by the name of [STW]. [CI-PERS] further told [CI-PERS] that the reason Marnie had not called home was because she was very embarrassed over something she had done. [CI-PERS] also stated that the police would not do any investigating to locate Marnie and that, if the police did locate her, they would not inform the family of her location. [CI-PERS] stated that she did not believe that the information from [CI-PERS] was reliable and that Marnie would always call home for money, if not for another reason.
52. I advised [CI-PERS] that I also found [CI-PERS] information to be less than reliable as, no matter where Marnie was living, Marnie would likely be accessing money from MHR. I further advised [CI-PERS] that I had made inquiries with the MHR in Alberta and that Marnie was not receiving any financial assistance in Alberta unless she was using an alias. I informed [CI-PERS] that I would contact the Fort Nelson RCMP and request that they re-interview [CI-PERS] regarding Marnie's whereabouts. I then forwarded a copy of my Continuation Report outlining the information from [CI-PERS] to Constable Kozlowski of the Fort Nelson RCMP and requested that additional inquiries be made with [CI-PERS]
53. On April 20, 1998, I called [CI-PERS] to advise her that I had requested that an investigator with the Fort Nelson RCMP speak with [CI-PERS] regarding the information she provided to [CI-PERS] about Marnie being in Edmonton. As the [CI-PERS] seemed to be having some difficulty not knowing Marnie's whereabouts, I asked [CI-PERS] if she or her husband would like help through RCMP Victim Services and [CI-PERS] stated that she would gladly accept the assistance.


54. Also on April 20, 1998, I contacted the local coroner, J. McFarlane, and requested that he make inquiries with the B.C. Coroner's Service again for any unidentified female bodies in the province.
55. On May 1, 1998, I sent a fax to the Chief Coroner's office in Vancouver, requesting that they make inquiries throughout the province again for unidentified female remains that might fit Marnie's description. I received a phone call from Chico Newell of the Chief Coroner's office, and he advised me that he had received my fax and that he agreed that due to Marnie's lifestyle she may be deceased. Mr. Newell stated that he would alert the Chief Medical Examiner's office in Washington State and have them examine all of their unidentified remains. Mr. Newell requested that a photograph of Marnie be forwarded to the Burnaby RCMP detachment where he would pick it up. I then had the Detachment's Forensic Identification Section send the photograph of Marnie to the Burnaby RCMP.
56. On May 1, 1998, [CI-PERS] called and provided me with her new address. I advised [CI-PERS] that I had not yet received any results from my request for inquiries in Fort Nelson, but that I had requested that the Chief Coroner's office check across the province again for any unidentified female remains. I further advised [CI-PERS] that the Chief Coroner's office was going to contact the Chief Medical Examiner's office in Washington State and have them make similar inquiries in the event that Marnie had gone to that area.
57. On May 8, 1998, I received a fax from Constable Kozlowski of the Fort Nelson RCMP, stating that his interview of [CI-PERS] had not produced any new information and that [CI-PERS] indicated that Edmonton seemed like a place Marnie might go, but that she could also have stayed in Vancouver.
58. On May 13, 1998, [CI-PERS] called and stated that the week prior she met a woman, who I will refer to as [CI-PERS], who stated that she had seen Marnie approximately two months earlier in the vicinity of Main Street and East Hastings Street in Vancouver. I advised [CI-PERS] that I would try and locate [CI-PERS] and interview her regarding Marnie. I further advised [CI-PERS] that the information received through [CI-PERS] about Marnie's whereabouts was not reliable.

59. On May 29, 1998, I received a phone call from Chico Newell of the Chief Coroner's office in Vancouver, requesting further information about Marnie. Mr. Newell stated that they had 11 unidentified female bodies and he had eliminated eight as being Marnie. Mr. Newell requested that Marnie's fingerprints be forwarded to the Burnaby RCMP detachment. I contacted the Detachment's Forensic Identification Section and requested that Marnie's fingerprints be forwarded to the Burnaby RCMP.
60. On June 1, 1998, I received a CPIC message from the Turner Valley RCMP detachment in Alberta, requesting a description of Marnie as they were investigating the death of an unidentified female who had likely met with foul play. I forwarded a copy of Marnie's fingerprints to the Turner Valley RCMP. Sergeant Purcell of the Turner Valley RCMP advised me on June 2, 1998, that the unidentified female was not Marnie.
61. On June 8, 1998, I spoke with [REDACTED] CI-PERS and advised her of my dealings with the Chief Coroner's office and that we still did not have any concrete information about Marnie. [REDACTED] CI-PERS asked if there was anything further we could do and I advised her that, at present, all avenues of investigation had been covered and now it was a matter of waiting. I advised [REDACTED] CI-PERS that I would continue to make inquiries with agencies such as MHR and notify [REDACTED] CI-PERS immediately if I received any information about Marnie.
62. On June 12, 1998, I received a phone call from Cheryl Yeager of the Chief Coroner's office who requested that all of Marnie's fingerprints be forwarded to the VPD to the attention of Ed Tempest, Coroner's Liaison Unit. I advised Ms. Yeager that I had already sent the fingerprints to Chico Newell and she advised that Mr. Newell had been too busy to take appropriate action and had asked her to follow-up on the prints. On June 15, 1998, I phone Ms. Yeager to advise her that Marnie's prints had been forwarded as she requested.
63. On July 16, 1998, I spoke with [REDACTED] CI-PERS who disclosed that she had used the services of a psychic to attempt to determine what happened to Marnie. The psychic told [REDACTED] CI-PERS that Marnie was deceased. [REDACTED] CI-PERS asked my opinion about the psychic and I advised her that, in my personal opinion, they were not reliable. [REDACTED] CI-PERS asked whether it would still be possible to identify a body after so many months and I assured her that, with the new

65. 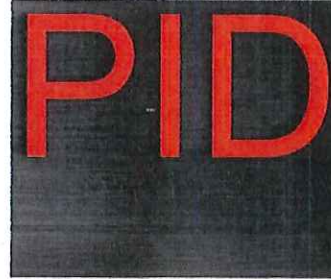

PROFILE

I am PID years of age and have been retired from the R.C.M. Police for 3 1/2 years, after serving for 37 years and 10 months. I retired with the rank of Staff Sergeant, and for the last 18 years of my service, I was the the N.C.O. in charge of the General Investigation Section at Campbell River Detachment.

EXPERIENCE

R.C.M.P. training, Depot Division, Regina, Sask., August, 1970 - March 1971

General Policing Uniform Duties, March 1971 - March 1972. These duties included patrol, routine investigations, dispute resolution and crime prevention.

General Uniform Policing duties, Oliver, B.C., March 1972 - October, 1972. These duties included general duty policing in a small town, often working alone with little or no supervision. I also involved utilizing a Community Policing Model in identifying problems within the community and rectifying them. Other duties included routine investigations pursuant to the Criminal Code, traffic enforcement, and various other Provincial Statutes.

General Uniform Policing Duties, Trail, B.C., October 1972 - April, 1976. Duties included Provincial Statue enforcement, investigations pursuant to the Criminal Code, crime prevention, and general patrol.

General Investigation Duties, Creston, B.C., April 1976 - June 1981. This was a one person plain clothes position in a community in close proximity to the U.S.A. border, where many duties required working in partnership with various law enforcement agencies from Idaho State. This position also required my being on call for extended periods of time, as well as extensive travel.

My duties involved the enforcement of various sections of the Narcotic Control Act in conjunction with the Privacy Act. Other duties included the investigation of property crimes, serious physical and sexual assaults, robberies and homicides within the Creston Community.

General Uniform policing duties, Quesnel, B.C., June 1981 - June 1983. In this capacity I was the senior Constable on a watch, involved in day-to-day policing duties, which included patrol enforcement of both Federal and Provincial statutes, such as impaired driving, property offenses, sexual assaults, domestic disputes and crime prevention.

General Investigation Section, Quesnel Detachment, June 1983 - September 1986. In this capacity I was involved in a wide variety of investigations which included serious sexual and physical assaults, property crimes, frauds/forgeries, robberies, overt/covert drug investigations, and several homicides.

Major Crime Section, Prince George Detachment, September 1986 - April, 1990. Plain clothes position wherein I acted as file co-ordinator, primary investigator for many serious incidents which included homicides, kidnapping, serious sexual/physical assaults, and I was also a qualified hostage negotiator. Additionally, I supervised/co-ordinated undercover operations for substance abuse offenses, as well as counselling a murder.

Major Crime Section, Campbell River Detachment, April 1990 - June 2008.
